POSITION: RN Supervisor

PROGRAM: Director of School Program

WHEN: Full Time/Exempt

DESCRIPTION:

Responsible for the day to day operation, and supervision of the Nursing Office and Classroom Nurses. Reports directly to the Director School Program with a dotted line reporting relationship to the Director of Programs and Services. Responsible for and oversight of routine and emergency medical care to students in the school program and adults receiving OPWDD services at the agency, under the direction of the Medical Director and Director of School Program. Follows through on all State Education Department (SED) mandates for medical care of students in the school program and the mandates of the Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD) for individuals served under OPWDD.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provides direction and supervision to Agency RNs and LPNs including scheduling, mentoring, timecard management.
- Administers first aid in emergencies when necessary. Notifies the President/CEO and Director of School Program and Director of Programs and Services of all-acute illnesses and serious emergencies requiring immediate medical attention.
- Follows Unusual Event/Incident Reporting procedures per agency policy.
- Carries out all prescribed orders for treatment and medication.
- Oversees orders for drug /medical supplies and inventory.
- Dispenses and supervises all prescription medications. Consults with staff regarding the individual response to medication.
- Maintains and oversees on-going medical charts and immunization records.
- Ensures direct care staff and nursing staff provide education of students/individuals in habits of hygiene/sexuality issues.
- Participates in staff training.
- Acts as liaison to community residences, parents/guardians, doctors and staff regarding medical needs of individuals.
- Ensures that the agency complies with NY State Education Department-mandated procedures (vision, hearing and scoliosis screenings; immunization surveys, physical exams, etc.) and OPWDD mandates (TB screening, HVB/HIV precautions, self-medication evaluations, medical intakes on new students).
- Ensures adequate nursing attendance at all appropriate case conferences, transition meetings, community meetings, and incident review committee meetings.
- Ensures medical coverage for Respite events and CBIs to oversee medication administration, and general well-being of individuals participating in the event.
- Ensures appropriate transportation for sick or injured students, individuals and/or employees for emergency medical treatment.

- Ensures nursing staff acts as a resource person to classroom teachers and staff re: physical/emotional health for students and adults receiving services.
- Consults with teachers and staff members concerning a variety of health factors related to non-attendance, communicable disease, and general health and progress of students.
- Responsible for the coordination, quality control, record keeping, dissemination of information, and integration of medical needs of students.
- Responsible for ensuring adherence to the overall policies of the agency/program as approved by the governing body and for conformance of the program to all applicable statutes and regulations.
- Communicate respectfully, openly, honestly, and directly.
- Facilitate trusting relationships and partnerships with administrators, parents/guardians, students, adults receiving services and co-workers.
- Promotes an environment that facilitates innovation, creative solutions, and empowerment.
- Ensures that decisions involve those who perform and are affected by the work.
- Demonstrates competency in leadership skills, work, and service.
- Serves as coach, mentor, and positive role model.
- Aligns all work and resource management with the organization's mission, vision, philosophies, values, goals, and strategic imperatives.
- Arranges for appropriate nursing coverage on a daily basis.
- Treats all minor illnesses to Student/Individuals of the agency.
- Demonstrates sensitivity to and respect for the diverse cultural backgrounds and practices of the students, staff and families of Holy Childhood.
- Other duties may be assigned.

EDUCATION and/or EXPERIENCE

The RN Supervisor shall be licensed and currently registered by the NYS and have three to five years of nursing experience. The RN Supervisor must have the ability to effectively lead a team of professionals, must be competent and proficient with current technological methods, and must have exemplary communication, organizational, and facilitation skills.

QUALIFICATIONS:

To perform this job successfully, an individual must be able to perform each essential duty satisfactorily. Candidates for this position will have: the ability to demonstrate, and provide examples of continuous personal development and improvement. An individual must have and maintain Professional Rescuer CPR certification and AED certification. Must be able to lift, push and pull 50 pounds.
